PCCC BUSINESS COMPLETED BY THE APPLICANTS FROM DECEMBER 2013.

1. The PCCC Applicants have finalised the Constitution and Charitable Trust to become the PCCC Entity so that land under the Tannum Sands, Boyne Island and Agnes Water ILUA's could be transferred and also all funds by way of compensation to also be transferred to the PCCC Corporate Entity

- a. The Constitution and Charitable Trust have now been approved by the State and the land is now in the process of being transferred to the new Entity. This is being done in conjunction with DNRM.
- b. The PCCC Nominated Entity has now been certified as incorporated with ASIC
- c. The Directors of the Entity are as follows:- Gooreng Gooreng-Tony Johnson, Norelle Watson, Bailai-Matty Cooke, Lee-Ann Dudley, Tarebilang Bunda-Dean Sarra, Willie Broome,

The applicants have also put in place the following after a period of consultation;

(1) FUNERAL ASSISTANCE POLICY FOR THE PCCC NATIVE TITLE CLAIM GROUP:

- Funding is capped at a total of \$2,000.00 per grant per Family.
- Eligibility for assistance must first be proven, by Representatives (2 Elders) from the relevant clan group.
- Where the deceased have their own Funeral Fund or Super Fund their family members will not be eligible for assistance.
- Members within the four PCCC Tribes (Bailai, Gurang, Gooreng Gooreng & Tarebilang Bunda Peoples) will only be considered on a case by case basis.
- Those who have passed must belong to one of the four Traditional Owner Groups or be their partner and children who have cultural, or traditional ties by marriage.
- Payment must be made to service providers/suppliers and not to families or individuals. Eg; Suppliers like funeral parlour, catering, hire of venues, etc.....

(2) SOCIO POLICY FOR THE PCCC NATIVE TITLE
GROUP; The applicants are currently have
developed a draft PCCC socio policy see
attached for consultation also attached is a
petition to get signed if supported and
return to Gidarjil office or PO Box 2773,
Bundaberg, 4670.

Agreement for the protection
of Cultural Heritage of the
PCCC People.

Agreements with the
